What We Heard from the Fall 2024 Parent Survey

A total of 101 parents responded to our parent survey.

Here are a few highlights:

Areas of Strength

96% of parents feel that their child is treated fairly 95% of our parents have talked with a teacher

92% of parents have attended meetings

81% of parents feel that their child feels included

80% of our parents feel welcome at CKES

79% of our parents believe the school to be inclusive

An average of 77% of our students have not experienced bullying in any form at school.

Only 8 % of our parents feel that the environment, curriculum and activities at CKES are NOT distinctly Catholic.

Potential Areas of Growth

77% of parents believe that CKES supports positive behaviors

74% of our parents support learning at home

76% of parents believe that the school is safe

75% of our parents believe that teachers support learning at CKES

75% of our parents feel informed

74% of parents feel that CKES religious programming meets or exceeds their expectations.
