Our progress reports have been published to the Aspen website and families have been accessing the reports. We know there was a delay within Aspen for some reports and a few families had difficulties with gaining access. However, for the vast majority, the process seems to have gone smoothly. We see many advantages to sharing reports in this manner: it is a more secure method; it allows parents to have a digital record of all reports, which will accumulate over the years; and allows efficient and equitable access for families in split households. If you have feedback to give us regarding how we communicate about using Aspen for the June final report cards, we are eager to hear from you. Of course, families who do not have reliable internet access may always request a printed report from the teacher.

One piece of feedback was that there is no place to indicate if a parent/guardian would like to meet with the teacher. Feel free to email any teachers with whom you would like to speak. This option is always open to you – at anytime. Now that you have fresh information about your student’s learning, it may prompt conversation. We also have student-led conferences scheduled for March 4, but please reach out now if you have questions.

Drop-off Safety Concerns

PLEASE DO NOT DROP STUDENTS OFF AT THE GRADE 2/3 OR 4/5 SIDE OF THE SCHOOL. This driveway is not on school property. It is not meant to be used by the school staff or parents. Currently, it is very unsafe for students who are playing in that area in the mornings, and very difficult for supervisors to watch for cars and students.
